What is the Great American Cleanup?

The Great American Cleanup is a nationwide program that encourages you to get involved in your own community. Millions of volunteers clean and beautify their community as part of the Great American Cleanup each spring.

The Great American Cleanup is the nation's largest organized annual cleanup, beautification, and community improvement program. Last year, more than 3.8 million volunteers participated in the Great American Cleanup.

The Great American Cleanup begins on March 1st and runs until May 31st. Keep Lee County Beautiful will host this year's cleanup program throughout Lee County.

How to Get Involved

There are many ways you can take part in the Great American Cleanup:

- **Organize your own neighborhood, park, or area cleanup** - If you would like to organize your own neighborhood, park, or area cleanup, simply fill out an online "Site Coordinator Registration Form" at www.klcb.org. If you do not wish to register online, you may send in the "Site Coordinator Registration Form" by mail. As a site coordinator registered with KLCB you can receive supplies for your cleanup event. Your event must be between March 1st and May 31st to receive garbage bags, posters, "Thank You" coupons, and other supplies (while supplies last).
